It's good h(a) unting for medium Hearn

DID a famous "ghost" provide unusual Survival evidence following medium Ronald Hearn's appearance on a TV programme about her that was screened last week?

Hearn was invited by the ITV "Today" team to try to contact the "White Lady." She is Lady Blanche, a 13th-century woman who is said to haunt the ruins of Rochester Castle, Kent.

After filming was over, Peter Ingold, a friend of Hearn, visited a veteran medium he knows 30 miles away. He told her of Hearn's televised ghost hunt.

Then they both felt an icy wind from a corner of the room.

"All doors and windows were closed," Ingold told PN. "There was no possible opening for such a draught."

The medium said she saw a woman "all dressed in white." Ten minutes later the icy wind attacker's armour and pierced blew again. The medium com-

Ingold telephoned Hearn that them — haunted such places.

night. The medium, whose evidential taped proxy sitting exploits have often been featured in PN, confirmed the details.

The programme had been filmed against a background of stone steps and a tower.

He added that an icy wind blew continuously into the microphone throughout the filming.

Since this incident the programme has been screened. Interviewer Monty Modlin described Hearn as a "very famous psychic research man." He introduced Hearn from the castle ruins.

Viewers heard that Lady Blanche was accidentally killed in the castle by her lover.

He returned to find her being assaulted by a knight. He fired an arrow which glanced off the her breast.

Hearn told Modlin about his psychic impressions. He explained why ghosts—or spirit entities as he correctly termed
